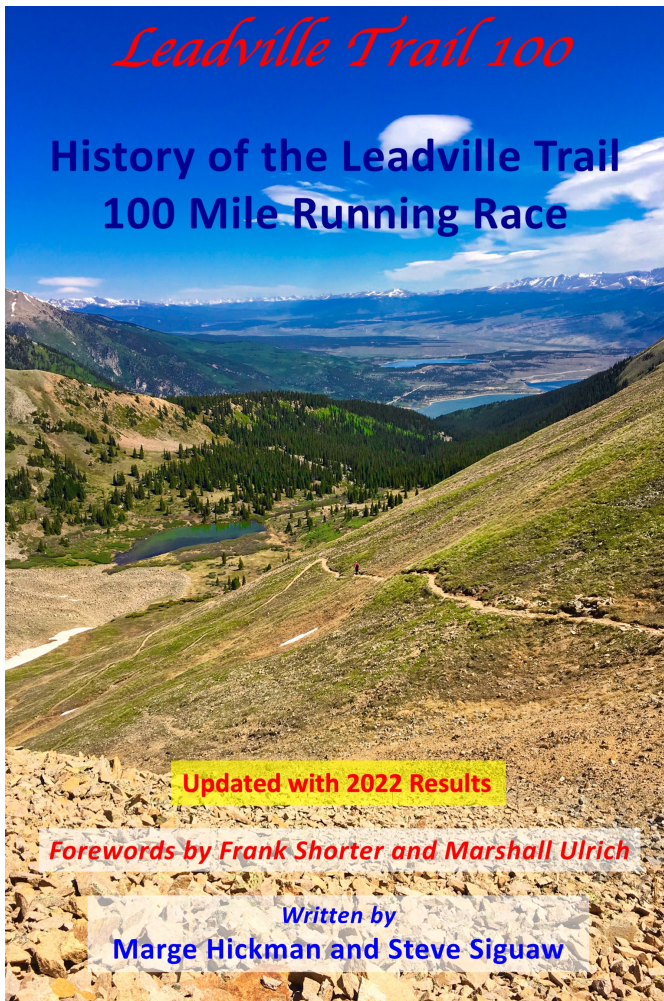

Chapter 16

The '20s

2022

Cloudy skies and forty-five degrees greeted 718 runners at the starting line at 6th and Harrison Street in downtown Leadville, Colorado for the 49th edition of the “Race Across the Sky”.

A total of 816 runners were accepted into the race, but as you just noticed, 78 runners didn't toe the magic line and begin this long journey amongst the Rocky Mountains in Colorado.

The first aid station, Mayqueen (12.6 miles), welcomed the lead runners of Adrian Macdonald, even though his tracker was not working, followed by Robert Strickland in 1:45:20, who lead Marvin Sandoval in 1:45:24.

The first-place woman striding into Mayqueen was Clare Gallagher in 1:47:38, and in 18th place overall. Second woman was Addie Bracy in 1:47:47, followed by Madeline Hirschfeld in 1:54:29. Unfortunately, the first official DNF was reported to be Erika Feigels at only 12.6 miles into the race.

The sky brightened over Sugarloaf Pass, with a welcoming orange glow breaking through the overcast as fleet-footed runners climbed high above Turquoise Lake.

First runner into Outward Bound aid station (23.5 miles) was Adrian Macdonald, followed by Matt Flaherty in 3:23:09. Tyler Andrews (3:24:56) was in third place and Matthew Vira in 3:26:19 was in fourth place.

Addie Bracy was first woman through in 3:35:29 (19th place overall) with Clare Gallagher on her heels in 3:36:27. Third place woman was Alisyn Hummelberg in 3:53:53. This early in the race, it seemed like two women were dueling for the championship prize.

642 runners remain in the race at Outward Bound, although that number is suspect since not all the timing chips seemed to be functioning properly. Luckily, the weather was cooperating by remaining cool and overcast – perfect running conditions!

Half Pipe Aid Station (29.3 miles)

Adrian Macdonald continued to lead the race, followed by Matt Flaherty with a time of 3:59:11, followed by JP Giblin in 3:59:12. These second and third place runners were averaging 8:10 miles. In fourth place was Tyler Andrews with a time of 4:04:30, along with Matthew Vira in fifth place with 4:05:44.

A large group of 10 runners were all running under 4:10 at this stage of the race.

Clare Gallagher retook first place, leading the women with a time of 4:17:49 (19th overall) and closely followed by Addie Bracy in 4:18:16. Third woman was Lindsey Herman in 4:26:09, followed by Alisyn Hummelberg running 4:39:26 in fourth place. Fifth place woman was Roxanne Vogel in 4:46:07.

Chip timing reported 669 runners remaining in the race, but again that number was not entirely accurate due to chip problems.

Twin Lakes Aid Station (37.9 miles)

Adrian Macdonald was first into Twin Lakes in 5:18:42 where he got a new, working, timing chip. Adrian's chip never worked since the start of the race, so no splits were automatically timed for him. In second place was JP Giblin in 5:26:05, third place was Tyler Andrews in 5:31:48 and fourth place was Matt Flaherty in 5:32:22.

The top 10 runners have been running sub 9-minute miles this far into the race. Another fast runner, Michael Nanaszko also got a new chip at TL.

The first woman flying into Twin Lakes was Addie Bracy in 5:56:19 (19th overall), followed by Lindsey Herman in 6:11:51, Alisyn Hummelberg in 6:26:52, Roxanne Vogel in 6:40:51 and in fifth place and Mickey Davis in 6:46:29.

But things were a bit hazy as ATHLINKS chip timing went out completely at Twin Lakes for a couple of hours.

Twin Lakes to Hopeless Aid Station (43.5 miles)

Coming out of Twin Lakes, Addie Bracy had a 1-minute lead on Clare Gallagher with Lindsey Herman 8 minutes behind.

Adrian Macdonald summited Hope Pass, running in first place over the top.

Winfield (50 miles)

Adrian Macdonald was first into Winfield with a time of 7:40:30 (9:13 min/mile). Wow!

In second place was Tyler Andrews in 7:55:17, followed by JP Giblin (8:09:50), Ryan Kaiser (8:19:45) and in fifth place was Christopher Harrington in 8:29:07.

First woman into Winfield was Addie Bracy in 8:50:01 (10:36 min/mile and 12th place overall). Stellar running!

Addie was closely followed by Clare Gallagher in 8:55:58. Next woman was Alisyn Hummelbert in 9:33:06 with the fourth place woman, Lindsey Herman, in 9:35:23 and fifth place woman at 9:53:01 was Kate LeVasseur in 45th place overall.

On the trail back over Hope Pass, Clare Gallagher retook the lead before the Hopeless Aid Station by 6 minutes over Addie Bracy. What a race.

Five hundred and twenty runners made the Winfield cutoff, out of 718 starters.

Twin Lakes Inbound (62.5 miles)

Adrian Macdonald maintained his significant lead by clocking 9:59:11 as he arrived at the Twin Lakes Aid Station. Just thirteen minutes back and in second place was Tyler Andrews in 10:12:02, followed by JP Giblin in 10:49:57, Ryan Kaiser 10:57:06 and in fifth place was Christopher Harrington in 11:23:19.

Coming into Twin Lakes, the lead woman was Clare Gallagher in 11:38:12 and behind her by 13 minutes was Addie Bracy in 11:51:52. Clare passed Addie on the climb back up Hope Pass and was now putting the hammer down.

Third woman was Alisyn Hummelberg in 12:45:50 followed by Lindsey Herman in 13:11:24 and in fifth place for the women, Kate LeVasseur in 13:33:42.

Half Pipe (71.1 miles)

Adrian Macdonald arrived in 11:30:50, followed by second place Tyler Andrews with a time of 12:07:48. A bit further back was JP Giblin in 12:36:25, followed by Ryan Kaiser in 12:45:05. Fifth place was owned by Christopher Harrington in 13:10:11.

Clare Gallagher arrived in 13:32:02, 9th place overall. Chasing Clare was Lindsey Herman in 15:28:31. Third place woman was Kate LeVasseur in 15:55:22, fourth place was Roxanne Vogel and rounding out the top five was Samantha Wood in 16:27:18.

Outward Bound (76.9 miles)

First to arrive was Adrian Macdonald in 12:08:01, just as Tyler Andrews arrived at Half Pipe, 5.8 miles and 38 minutes behind Adrian at this point in the race. But second place into Outward Bound was now Christopher Harrington in 13:55:53. It seemed Tyler Adams, JP Giblin and Ryan Kaiser all dropped out.

Third place belonged to Matthew Vira in 14:08:02, with Joel Anderson in fourth with a time of 14:13:39. Fifth place was Guillaume Perrot in 14:13:44.

Clare Gallagher, first place woman, had moved into 7th place overall with a time of 14:16:46.

Runners racing for second through seventh places, overall, was much too tight to call at this point. It was anybody's guess.

May Queen (87.8 miles)

Lead runner Adrian Macdonald bolted through May Queen Aid Station in a time of 14:06:25, with a commanding lead over the rest of the field.

Tyler Andrews followed with a time of 15:38:29, JP Giblin in 15:40:35, Ryan Kaiser with a time of 15:48:55 and Christopher Harrington in 16:23:21.

Clare Gallagher arrived as first place woman in 17:04:04 (12th overall), followed by Alisyn Hummelberg in 18:52:10. Third place woman was to Lindsey Herman in 19:40:54, fourth place woman was Roxanne Vogel followed by Madeline Hirschfeld in fifth place with a time of 20:42:46.

A total of 355 runners made it back to May Queen Aid Station. Yet it seemed 8 runners, with the last runner in place #363, Hawaiian Shirt Ray Churgovich (26:46:46), missed the cutoff at Mayqueen Aid Station enroute to his 10th Leadville finish. This is always heartbreaking with only 12.6 miles remaining in the race.

Finish (100 miles)

Adrian Macdonald won the 2022 Leadville Trail 100 mile trail race with a time of 16:05:44. His winning time put him number three on the all-time fastest time ever on the course. Adrian also eclipsed his 2021 winning time of 16:18:19.

Adrian's winning margin of over 2 hours over second place is one for the record books.

JP Giblin grabbed second place with a time of 18:07:50, 2 hours and 2 minutes behind champion Adrian Macdonald.

Third place went to Ryan Kaiser in 18:21:21, followed by Tyler Andrews 18:40:04 and in fifth place was Christopher Harrington in 18:45:08.

The women's champion and 12th overall was Glare Gallagher in 19:37:57. Her winning margin of 2 hours 21 minutes on the second place woman surpassed Adrian's winning margin and will also go into the record archives.

Second place for the women went to Alisyn Hummelberg with a time of 21:58:59 and 25th overall. Third place woman was Lindsey Herman in 22:50:41 and in fourth place for the women was Roxanne Vogel in 23:21:33. Fifth woman was Madeline Hirschfeld in 23:57:45.

The last third of the race saw the women's race blow completely apart with place changes rampant over the high-altitude mountain trails. What a competition it truly was.

A few more statistics for the 2022 edition of the race:

- A total of 718 runners started the race with 365 runners finishing the race (51% finishing percentage)
- 453 first-time runners started with 242 finishing the race
- 159 female runners started the race
- 559 male runners started the race
- A total of 85 runners earned the coveted big buckle, running under 25 hours, including ten women.
- 241 runners finished under 29 hours
- 305 runners finished under 29:30
- 365 runners finished under 30 hours
- Last place finisher was Mickey Martin in 29:55:17. He turned around at Winfield in 13:05

- Alex Knight's time was 13:51 at Winfield and he finished the race in 29:54:55; Pretty amazing considering his Winfield time
- Eric Pence marked his 27th finish this year in 29:31:59
- Margaret Montfort, age 62, 29:44:06 – oldest female finisher
- Jan Olsson, Sweden, age 65, 28:14:08 – oldest male finisher
- Rodrigo, the Dream Chaser, finished in 21:02:22, 18th place overall. He passed 657 runners after starting 2.5 hours after the official start of the race. Considering Rodrigo's painful recovery from his traumatic cycling accident earlier this year, made his finish was all the more amazing.
- Ian Sharman, previous four-time champion, stopped at mile 23 after pouring his soul into preparing for the race this year.
- Anton Krupicka did not start the race
- Ultrarunning legends Scott Jurek and Courtney Dauwalter paced runners during the race
- Leadman was renamed Lead Challenge: The five-race series at Leadville. Men's 2022 winner, JP Giblin (35:59:32) just missed the record held by Wesley Sandoval (35:54:55). Woman's 2022 winner was Samantha Wood (46:10:51)
- Nadya Dhadiala claimed her fifth DNF, unfortunately, after failing to make the Twin Lakes cutoff inbound
- Marge Hickman, previous women's champion, did not start the race (please see her comments below)

2022 Race notes regarding new changes and miscellaneous items:

- Belt buckles were given in the finish line chute. Finisher jackets were printed and mailed to all athletes.
- There was a Thursday night dinner available for purchase at \$125 and seating was limited to 200 people. Yes, even vegan items were offered, in case you were wondering...
- Lake County High School football field was used for the pre-race briefing at 10am on Friday before the race start.
- Crewing

Crew access for the 2022 edition of the race remained as it was in 2021. Specifically¹,

- Only one crew vehicle is allowed for each runner

- There are four official crewing locations with vehicle access (Crewing outside of these four locations is against official race rules and may result in disqualification of the runner):
 - Outward Bound
 - Pipeline
 - Twin Lakes
 - Mayqueen

It should be noted that No crew, spectators or pacers are allowed at Winfield.

- Pacers

Pacers can pick their runners up at any point in the race, **beginning** at Twin Lakes **inbound (Mile 62)**.

Only one pacer at a time is allowed, although you can have as many pacers as you wish for the race.

Pacers can act as burros for their runner – carrying food, equipment, etc. for the runner.

Pacers cannot push, pull, carry or tow the runner. (Does this really need to be said?)

No vehicles or bicycles are allowed to pace a runner or render assistance to a runner in the form of aid.

- Ultrarunning Magazine was also contacted to see if they would have an article about the 2022 race. This was the reply from Amy, the editor: “At this point, we haven't received any race reports or images from photographers from the race, so it's unlikely we'll cover Leadville this year.”

Summary from Marge Hickman, co-author of this book, about her journey toward the 2022 Leadville Trail 100 mile race:

“Last year’s Leadville race (2021) was disappointing and a heartbreak for me as I lost my mental toughness to get in and out of the Winfield aid station.

I arrived at Winfield in 13:47 with only minutes to get my butt out of there and back up and over Hope Pass. I noticed many runners sitting under the tent at Winfield, those who had already dropped out of the race.

I lost my focus, was too tired and believed I could never make it back over Hope to Twin Lakes under the cutoff time. So, I dropped out of the race, even though I was feeling good but tired...a poor excuse to quit.

Prior to the race, I was contacted by a journalist who writes for several sports magazines. He wanted to feature me in an article about my running career at Leadville: A full and thorough story “of my life” and running, including my long history with the Leadville race.

I was excited and thrilled about this opportunity to tell my story. We stayed in contact via email, texts and many phone calls. During the 2021 Leadville race, a photographer even showed up to take photographs of me and followed along the entire course.

Unfortunately, the article was refused by a major running magazine. It was also rejected by another running magazine before the “The New York Times” decided to publish his article.

The New York Times article was published on August 7, 2022, just two weeks before this year’s LT100 run.

I was so excited and couldn’t wait to read it, assuming the article was going to be a great story with pictures.

However, when I saw the article online, my heart dropped to the floor. It was nothing like I had expected.

The article was short, had errors, mistakes, and also included three paragraphs about other athletes and things I never said, or stories that were misinterpreted.

Therefore, I decided to cancel my airline reservation and car rental even though I committed to being on the starting line for the 2022 Leadville race.

Prior to the publication of the New York Times article, I never had the opportunity to proofread the story and had placed all my faith in the professional writer.

Before the article was published, I had sent a copy of my book, “**Leadville Trail 100; History of the Leadville Trail 100 Mile Running Race**” to the writer for his reference about my accomplishments, etc.

I was so disappointed with the article that I decided to defer my entry until 2023, when I plan to be on the starting line when that gun fires off.

Even though the New York Times article was personally disappointing, my hope was for the story to emphasize that Jim Butera was the true Founder and first Race Director of the Leadville Trail 100 mile running race.

Jim Butera, the man with a dream, the brains and will power to travel through the Rocky Mountains with his measuring wheel and find the best possible location for a 100-mile trail race. Jim was the quintessential humble and kind mountain man of an ultrarunner who just loved to run and wanted to promote the sport and make his dream come true. And he obviously succeeded. RUN ON!”

Finally, Dale Perry – Four-time finisher and ultrarunner supreme, who also went by the name Sasquatch, sadly passed away on September 4, 2022. His last words to me were *“When the Dr says there is nothing more that can be done, it's like hearing the cutoff bell at Halfmoon.”*
